

RANDY NEWBERG, OUTDOOR COOKING CHAMPIONSHIP, RV & BOAT SALE HEADLINE 2021 CENTRAL OREGON SPORTSMEN'S SHOW®

REDMOND, OR – The Central Oregon Sportsmen's Show presented by Leupold returns to the First Interstate Bank Center and Deschutes County Fair & Expo, March 11th-14th, 2021. New features, personalities and exhibits are planned for this year's show including the Central Oregon Sportsmen's Show Outdoor Cooking Championship.

This year's Central Oregon Sportsmen's Show is going to look different this year. To comply with State COVID guidelines a number of measures have been put in place to assure everyone's safety at all times during the show starting with mandatory face protection/mask wear. Social distancing standards of at least 6' will be in place at all times on the fairgrounds. Also for 2021, the show will be using a timed ticketing measure to manage the number of people attending the show at any one time. There will be two flights of tickets for specific blocks of time sold Thursday, Friday and Sunday, and three blocks on Saturday. All tickets will be sold online to limit ticket takers exposure. Expect to see wider aisles, lots of hand-sanitizing stations and all seating areas will be appropriately distanced to keep people safe. Again, these changes are in place to keep people safe at all times before, during and after the show. These measures are required so we can hold the show.

The Central Oregon Sportsmen's Show is thrilled to welcome celebrated big game hunter and public lands and public access advocate, Randy Newberg. Randy will be at the show Thursday to Sunday holding a daily Q& A session in the seminar area. When he's not sitting down answering questions he'll be wandering the grounds along with everyone else. This is a rare opportunity to meet and connect with one of the really great guys in the hunting and outdoor industry. He's well known to enthusiastic elk and deer hunters through his many videos and podcasts, but he does it all and is as knowledgeable and helpful as anyone you'll ever meet.

of competition: bread, main course and dessert. This competition is a points-qualifier for national and international competitions.

Maybe there's a set of antlers in the attic that's been gathering dust for decades you inherited from a great great uncle...bring them in!

There's a fee to have antlers, horns, head or antler sheds measured, \$10, and another entry fee, \$30, if they are entered into the competition. It's well worth it!
